MSW Part Time Program

Part-time Study:

Students enrolled in the M.S.W. part time program shall complete the following courses in the semester indicated. Students who meet all requirements can expect to complete the degree in three years. The program of study includes two (2) elective courses. One must be a social work elective and the other may be a social work or non-social work elective. The student can choose the semesters in which to take the two (2) elective courses. *Below are suggested semester options for taking elective courses.
