WHY Georgia State University's Department of Economics?

- We are part of **one of America's best public affairs graduate schools**: the Andrew Young School of Policy Studies, ranked 23rd among policy schools in the U.S.
- ➤ Recent tenure-track placements for graduates of our program include Indiana University, University of Connecticut, Williams College, and Wake Forest University.
- Our faculty consistently publishes dozens of articles a year in scholarly journals including Econometrica, American Economic Review, Journal of Political Economy, Quarterly Journal of Economics, and Review of Economic Studies, among others.
- Our faculty hold appointments with prestigious research organizations such as the NBER and IZA and editorial positions at several leading scholarly journals.
- > Our department ranks highly in research productivity. According to Research Papers in Economics, among U.S. economics departments we rank:
 - o #42 overall (#1 in Georgia)
 - Top 10 in experimental economics
 - o Top 20 in public and urban economics
 - Top 30 in labor and environmental economics
 - Top 40 in health economics
- Financial aid is provided to most students: tuition waivers, first year research assistantships up to \$18,000, fellowships up to \$28,000 and teaching assistantships for continuing students.
- > We are located in Atlanta, a hub for federal agencies, nonprofits and businesses.
